Outline for focus group with nurses The following questions were set by the Project Manager for a focus group with the Neighbourhood Nurses at the conclusion of the project. This group was facilitated by the Clinical Supervisor on 30 October 2006, assisted by the Professional Practice Coordinator.

1. Were people sufficiently informed about the project and how could we (Project Team/DHB) have done this better?
2. How involved did you feel in the roll out and progression of the project? Did you feel listened to? Was action taken in a timely manner to support you? How could this have been improved?
3. Do you think the role of Neighbourhood Nurse 'works'? Why? How could the role be further enhanced/evolved?
4. How well prepared were you for the role (as the project progressed) and how well were you prepared to develop the role further?
5. What advice would you give nurses taking on a 'new' untried role?
6. What advice would you give the DHB in trying to introduce such a role change?
7. Overall what were the best aspects of the project and how could we (Project Team/DHB) have done better?
